"SATURDAY MECHANIC"

"SAFETY"

Read recently in our local paper about a man being killed while working under his car when the jack slipped.

Take the time to include safe practices when working on your car. THINK about each job. Watch the fan blades while working on a running engine. It is easy to get involved in a tune-up and forget the turning fan.

The electrical system, distributor, coil and spark plugs can produce a shock. The current won't hurt you, but your reflexes can cause bruised elbows, bumping your head, etc. You could even knock out a hood support.

Battery charging can cause severe burns from rings, jewelry, or tools grounding; not to mention the dangers of battery acid. Before lifting a battery, make sure the filler caps are tight.

When in a garage with the engine running, be sure to have plenty of ventilation, and do not smoke.

Take extra precautions with gasoline. Hot exhaust or even a spark from wrenches can cause an explosion.

DO'S AND DON'TS

- DO chock wheels, even if on level ground.
- DO use the emergency brake.
- DO wear goggles when handling batteries, brake fluid, and gasoline.
- DON'T go under a jacked car without jack stands or solid blocks.
- DO THINK SAFETY.

Drive carefully and defensively.

**TUNE-UP (Part 1)
DISTRIBUTOR**

- A. Removal**
1. Unclip both distributor cap retaining clips (Fig 20) and lift off cap.
 2. Disconnect primary wire (5/16" nut (Fig 20)
 3. Disconnect vacuum line (3/8" nut.)
 4. Remove both 7/16" bolts at base of distributor. Pull distributor out. **DO NOT LOOSEN NUT AND BOLT ON MOUNTING PLATE (Fig. 21)**
- B. Removal of contact set (points & condenser)**
1. Remove rotor (Fig. 21)
 2. Remove 1/4" nut and washer. Save all washers.
 3. Lift out plastic insulator, condenser, & primary wires.
 4. Remove Phillips screw securing condenser & remove condenser (Fig. 21)
 5. Remove screw holding contact set and remove contacts (points).
- C. Check distributor condition.**
1. Replace Rotor. Hold drive tang (Fig. 21) and check rotor for snugness. If loose, replace it.
 2. Hold drive tang, turn rotor hard to left. It should move about 1/8" and return when released. This checks the automatic advance. If no movement or it does not return, spray CRC under plate to loosen.
 3. Check vacuum unit (Fig. 21) by placing an oil suction pump on threaded and pull. Plate should advance about 1/4".
 4. Check bushing at base of distributor. The tang should have no play.
- D. Disassembly of distributor.**
1. Mark tang, shaft, and rotor positions to aid in reassembling.
 2. Remove rotor.
 3. Disconnect vacuum unit arm of spring from contact plate.
 4. Remove small wire retainer on end of micrometer nut shaft.
 5. Unscrew micrometer adjusting nut and pull out vacuum unit.
 6. Remove both Phillips screws on outer edge of contact plate and remove both plates (together).

MET TUNE UP (CONTINUED)

7. Remove screw in top of center shaft and pull off top section of shaft.
8. Lift out automatic advance control and spacer.
9. Knock out pin in drive tang, remove tang & spacer and pull out shaft.

Clean all parts, replace bushing in distributor housing and reassemble by reversing Step D. Make sure marks are aligned.

E. Installing Contact Set

1. Place contact set over 1/2" long shaft.
2. Install screw in plate, snug, not tight.
3. Place smaller fiber washer over threaded shaft of contact plate.
4. Place larger fiber washer over unthreaded shaft.
5. Place second part of contacts on 1/2" long shaft and place spring loop over the threaded shaft.
6. Install condenser, secure Phillips screw, and place primary and condenser wire ends over threaded shaft.
7. Slide plastic insulator on threaded shaft, centering wire ends and spring, so there is insulation between wires and shaft.

NOTE: If contact spring, condenser, or primary wires on threaded shaft touch metal, it will cause a ground and the engine won't run.

F. Gap Setting

1. Rotate cam (Fig. 21) till high part of cam is touching fiber block on contacts.
2. Using screwdriver in slot provided (opposite side of fiber) turn until .016 feeler gauge is snug in gap. Tighten contact plate screw, (new contacts will wear about .002). Rotate cam, recheck gap. Reset if necessary.
3. Lubricate cam lightly - vasoline or chassis grease will work.
4. Reinstall rotor.

G. Reinstall Distributor

1. Place distributor in hole and rotate rotor until distributor drops in slot.
2. Connect wires and line by reversing Step A.

- H. Inspect distributor cap for worn carbon in center of hairline cracks. Small cracks will cause a miss, especially on wet or humid days.

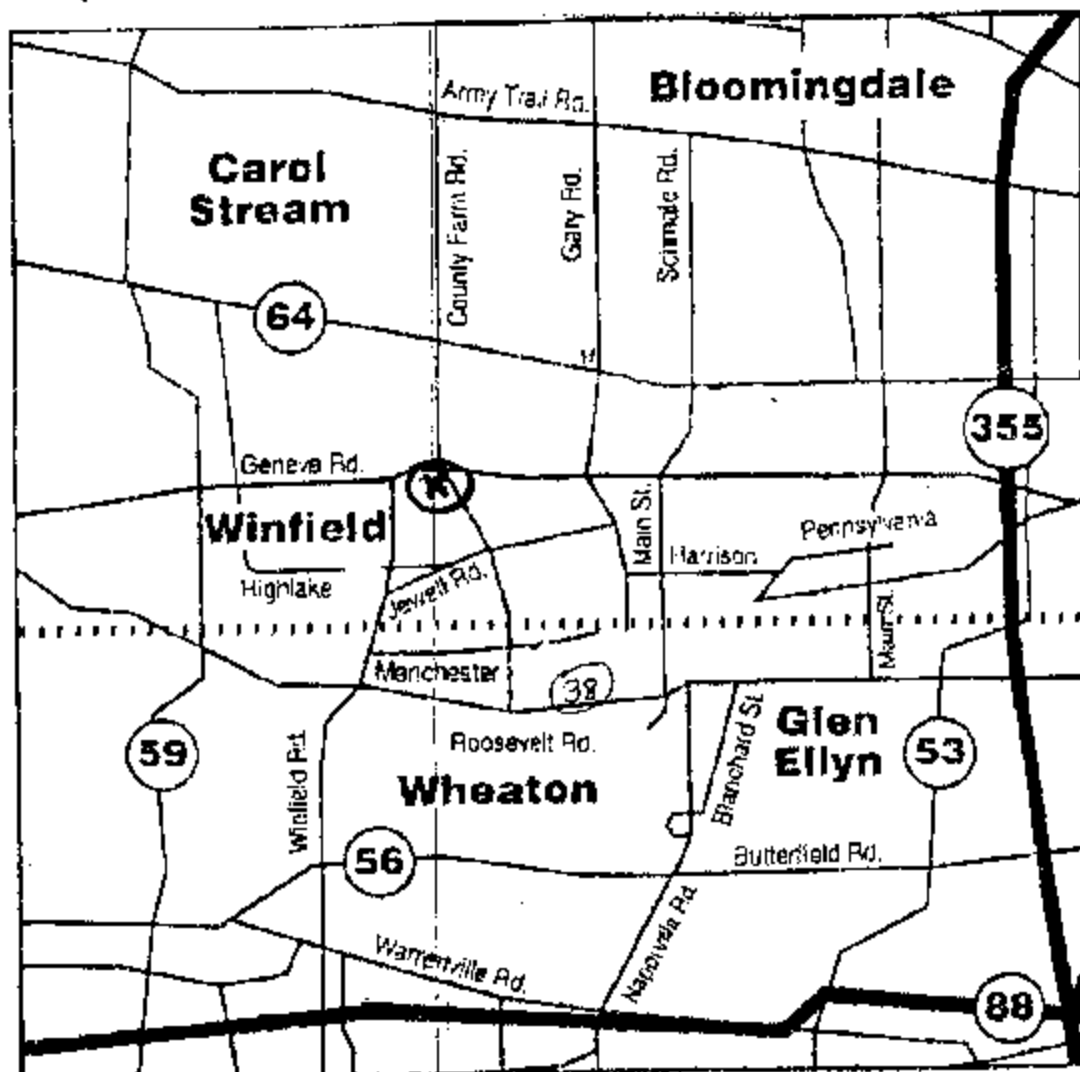
Time : 11:30 am to 2:00 pm
